

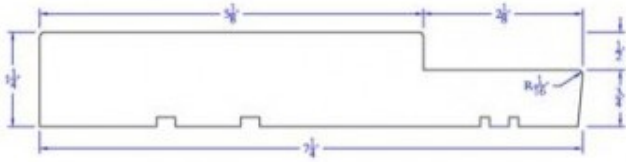
Alder has the following characteristics:

- Alder has a light tan or honey color that is very uniform. There is no color difference in the heartwood and sapwood.
- Alder stains and finishes easily and can be colored to match many other hardwoods.
- It machines well and glues easily.
- Alder has a fine grain similar to cherry, birch or maple.
- Alder is an excellent choice for interior finish of all types, furniture, paneling, molding and cabinetry.
